

As part of our success in providing positive participation,

communication and interaction between students, families, and the local community we have a partnership with the Koya Aboriginal Corporation. The Koya Aboriginal team has been working with the Southwell community to create innovative and sustainable participation at school while maintaining the heritage of Indigenous culture and pride. The Koya Aboriginal team assists Southwell to be culturally responsive to the needs of Aboriginal children.

The Koya Aboriginal team promote understanding and harmony in the school through the homework Club and classroom work. The Southwell Homework club is run and managed by aboriginal people. Originally the club was for aboriginal students and is now open to all students. With so many children and families appreciating the club it soon caught on as 'the thing' to do after school. The club is clearly a harmonious group who show genuine appreciation for the availability of the club.

The Koya Aboriginal team build on the knowledge, skills and prior experiences that Aboriginal students bring with them to the classroom to ensure learning is relevant, connected and appropriate to achieve education success. Together, Southwell and Koya teams make connections between each student's home and school experiences, and use a range of learning opportunities that make schooling more effective for Aboriginal students.

Through the classroom work the Southwell and Koya teams create welcoming and supportive learning environments that respect the cultures, languages, experiences and world views of their Aboriginal students. Those working one to one in classrooms have a holistic approach to working with Aboriginal students.

We put in our efforts together, so that Southwell and Koya work to close the gap in the education achievements of Aboriginal students. I would like to thank Koya for working with Southwell to nurture Aboriginal students as confident and successful learners who complete their schooling with the knowledge and skills to access further education, training and employment.

We especially thank Bobby and Dylan for their efforts and we are glad you are part of our school.


